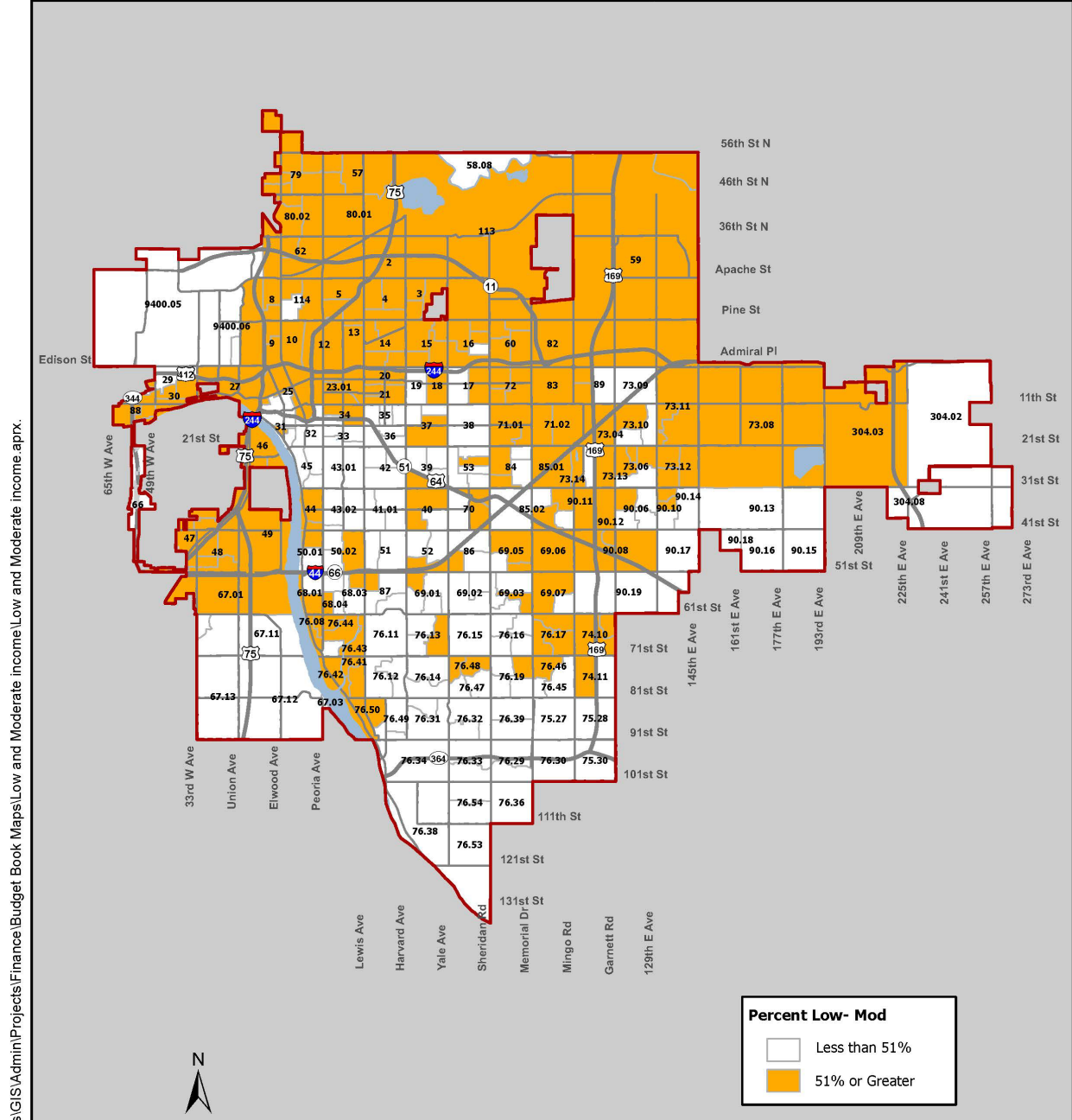

Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan

Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plan

- All activities funded with HUD funds must be described in the grantee's Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plans
- City's Consolidated Plan
 - ▶ *Five-year plan to help states and local jurisdictions assess their affordable housing and community development needs and market conditions, and to make data-driven, place-based investment decisions.*
 - ▶ *Establishes priority needs and goals to guide funding over five-year period.*
- Annual Action Plan
 - ▶ *One-year plan that more specifically targets funds to projects that relate to goals in the Consolidated Plan.*
 - ▶ *Describes how a funds in a given year will be allocated across Consolidated Plan goals.*



Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing

Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing

- Recipients of funding from HUD are required to comply with fair housing laws and must make certifications to affirmatively further fair housing. The AI helps to fulfill this requirement.
- The AI process helps identify barriers that limit housing opportunities based on protected characteristics (such as race, disability, or income level).
- AIs include action steps for addressing identified impediments.
- The AI is completed on a five-year cycle consistent with the Consolidated Plan, but it is a separate planning document.
 - ▶ *Some goals may cross over, but some are distinct to the AI.*
 - ▶ *The AI does not discuss how dollars are allocated to address goals and HUD does not separately fund fair housing activities.*

Data Analysis and Mapping

Data Analysis and Mapping

- Both plans rely on data analysis and mapping to assess changes in demographics and community needs.
- Some data points are similar while others are distinct. For instance, both the Consolidated Plan and AI looks at housing indicators like cost burden. The AI separately assesses access to opportunity through data such as transportation commute times and lending data analysis.
- TDA includes mapping analysis to more easily understand geographic trends in the data.



Community Outreach

Community Outreach

- Three-part community outreach strategy
 - ▶ *Online surveys*
 - Stakeholder Organization Survey and Resident Survey
 - Available in English & Spanish
 - Paper submissions accepted.
 - ▶ *Stakeholder Sessions*
 - 7 sessions formatted around topic areas
 - ▶ *Community meetings for residents*
 - 4 meetings open to the public at locations around the City
